## **About University of Mumbai**

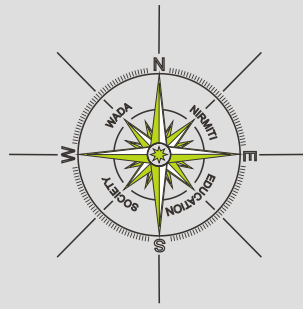

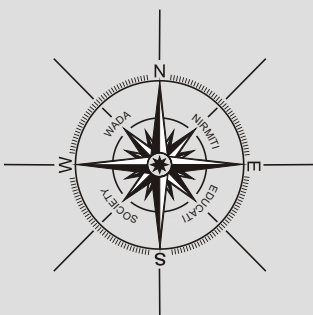

## ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

**Minimum Qualification:** - HSC (XII Std.)with Mathematics or Statistics and should have secured not less than 45% marks in aggregate for open category and less than **40% marks in aggregate in case of reserved category candidates**. Candidates who have passed Diploma Engineering from recognized Board of Technical Education are eligible for direct admission to the Second Year of the B.Sc.IT degree course, with minimum 45% marks required in aggregate for open category and 40% marks in aggregate for reserved category candidates.

## ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

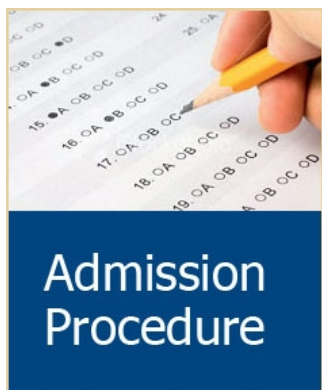
## **ADMISSION GUIDELINE :**

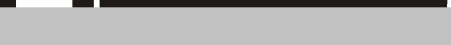
